Biography



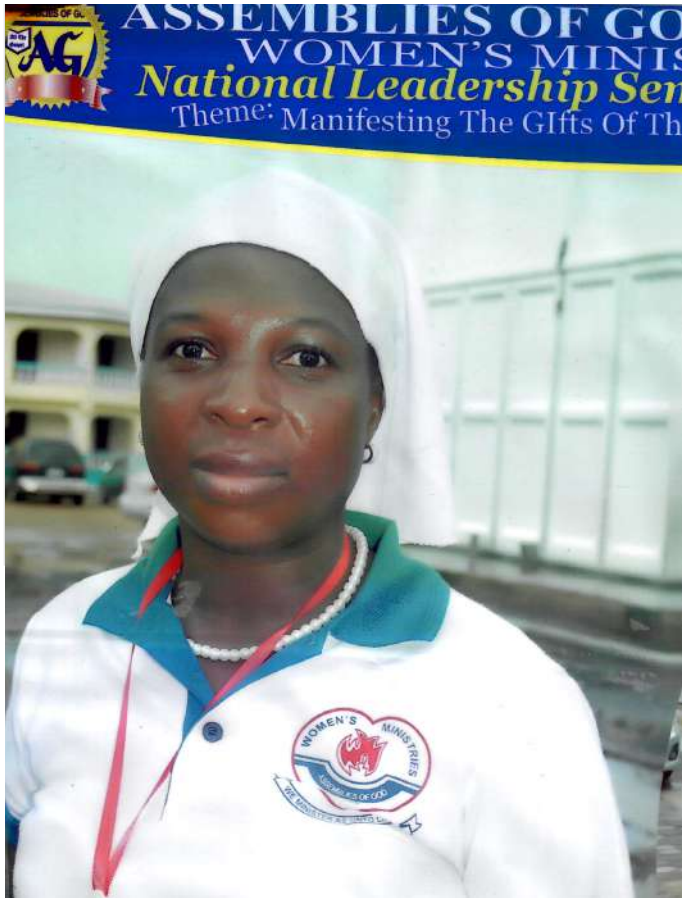
Madam Paulina Akosua Adutwumwaa was born on the 7th of May, 1972 in Ahafo-Mim to Mr. Yaw Sarpong of Asante Asokore Mampong and Evangelist Janet Opoku of the Eko)na clan of Ahafo Mim. She had her basic education at the Mim Model Basic School, formally MTC and continued her secondary education at the Mim Senior High school and Ola Girls Senior high School respectively. After completing form 5 successfully with good passes in all subjects, she decided to do business instead of furthering her education. She started a business of selling timber where she met her spouse, the late Mr. Abass of blessed memory who was also a timber merchant.

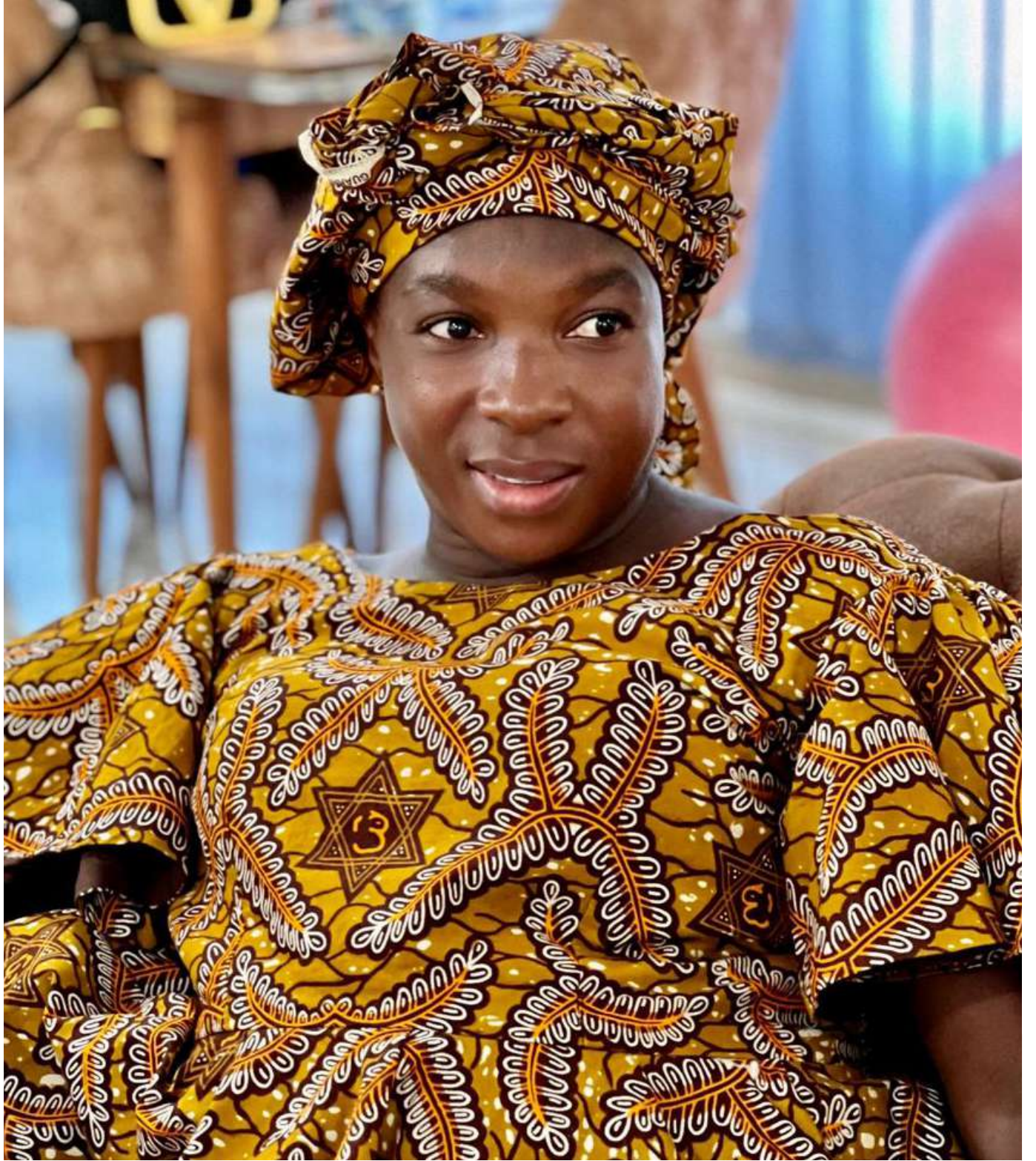
Her marriage to Mr. Abass was blessed with four children, Nana Ama Fosua (Ahafo Ama), Atta Snr and Junior and Afia-pokua Esther. After separating with her first spouse, she moved to the city of Accra in the early 2000s to continue her life. She was a sports person and was sometimes seen training with a ladies football team at the Achimota Anglican school park, near Akweteyman.



LIFE IN THE CITY OF ACCRA

Madam Akosua Adutwumwaa was a hardworking and industrious woman who did everything she could to support her children. In the city of Accra, she started as a trader in Achimota and later moved to Adenta and worked at the Adenta Municipal Assembly for years before establishing her own business at Pantang Junction (Healthy Food Joint). She did so well for herself in the restaurant business and added retail of rice to her business. She procured a plot of land at PNT, a place near Pantang junction and started building her house but the building was unfortunately demolished when she got to the lential stage due to litigations on the land. She later moved to Ritz Junction and worked as a tutor at the Elim basic school, the reason some people called her madam. It was at Ritz junction that she met her current husband Mr. David Adeyemi Burgson Narh with whom she had two daughters, Edna Davids and Magdalene Davids. She later moved to settle at Adenta-Amanfrom (Richville Estates) with the family in a house she built with her husband. She lived at Amanfrom till her demise.





S O C I A L A N D R E L I G I O U S L I F E

Madam Paulina Akosua Adutwumwaa was a friendly and lovely person who entertained everyone around her. She was baptized as a Methodist at an early age in Mim before moving to the city of Accra in the early 2000s. She had great love for God and worshipped in several churches. In every church that she worshipped, she held various positions. Before her demise, she was the women's fellowship leader of the Christ Apostolic Church International, Adenta-Amanfrom branch and also a board member of the leadership of the CACI central at Adenta. She was also a strong member of the ruling New Patriotic Party and before her demise was the Npp chairman for the newly created koose Electoral Area in the Adenta constituency. She contributed immensely to the NPPs victory in the 2020 elections.

Aside her political influence, she was also the secretary for the residents association in Adenta-Amanfrom (Richville Estates). She was very instrumental in all activities within her community and was highly respected by all. Madam Paulina was dedicated to her duties at church, community and political party. One legacy she left that is worth emulating is her selflessness and dedication in every task she performed and her love and respect for people regardless of their social status. She had seven children and had a healthy relationship with them until she fell sick in 2022. She battled with the sickness for some time until death took her away in January, 2023. She was a lovely and selfless person and will forever be remembered by all who knew her.

This message from the scripture has been the message consoling our broken hearts since the demise of our lovely mother, sister and friend.

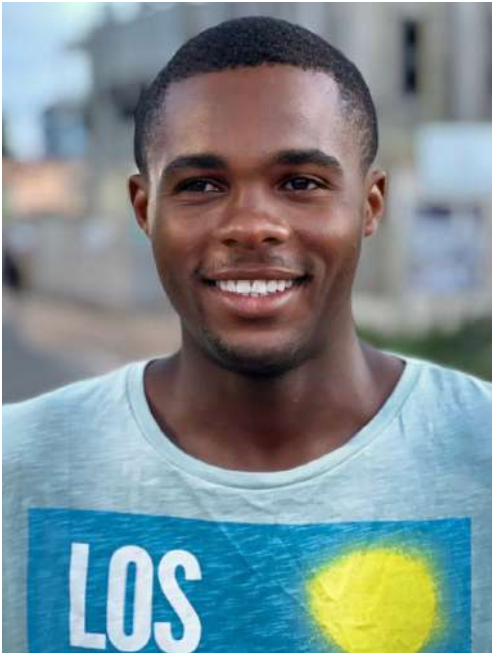
Madam Paulina Akosua Adutwumwaa, Auntie Paulina as people called you when were alive, you have left many in pain and sorrow.

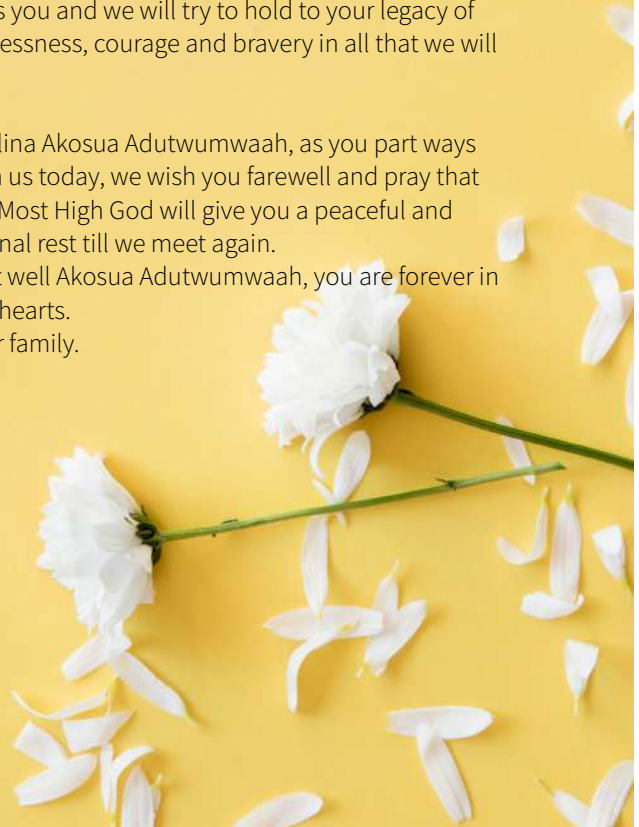
Despite your kindness, you were also discipline in all that you did.

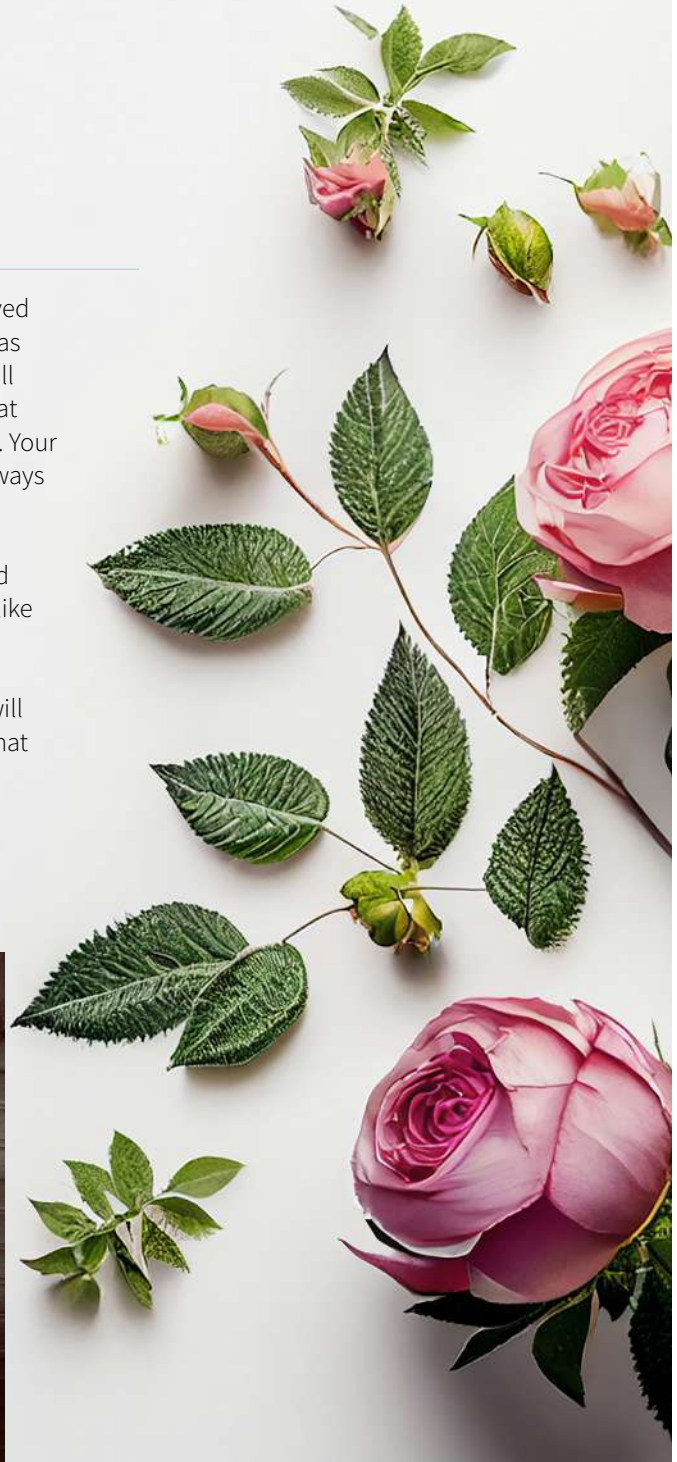
TRIBUTE BY GRANDCHILDREN
