BIOGRAPHY OF THE LATE ELDER SOLOMON ZUMARO

"Praise we the peaceful men of skill who builded homes of beauty. And, rich in art made richer still the brotherhood of duty". (M.H.B 896)



h e n William George Tarrant wrote this hymn in the 19th century, it was as if he had the Late Elder Solomon Zumaro in mind because that was what he stood for. Skillfulness, industrious,

dutiful among others were what can be used to describe him.

The late Elder Solomon ZUMARO also known as King Solomon or Bobo or Yahya, was born in 1935 at Tatale in the then Northern Region. His father Mr Tchedre ZUMARO (the chief of the village) and Mother Fatima were fervent Muslims and highly respected. Elder Solomon, the fourth(4th) of five (5) children was well behaved, lovely and respectful. He started his early education in the Northern region where he later graduated as a qualified engineer driver from a European sponsored Technical school in the late 1950's.

Elder Solomon, after his education travelled to Accra to seek greener pastures as it was in the days. He gained his first employment into a company in Accra as a driver upon arrival. Determined to take diving international, he applied and was accepted as a senior driver to the Ambassador in the then Tunisia Embassy. He later joined the Cote d'Ivoire Embassy as a personal driver to the Ambassador.

Also, he entered the then famous one-pound transport business from Accra to Aflao. The then Acheampong Government knowing how hard working and serious he took that business, contracted his company, to provide transport service for the government workers. After the contract with the Acheampong government, he then opened the following businesses of which he managed with his family till

his demise: Spare parts shops(travelling to Lagos for supplies), Building materials shops and plumbing shops and then also real estates in Ghana and other West African countries.

Elder Solomon began life as a Muslim and married four wives at different stages of life and was blessed with thirteen children. As fate may have it, Elder Solomon received Christ under a rather unusual circumstance. He was taken ill for a long time during which he had tried every medical means to get well but this proved unsuccessful. He was convinced by a close friend to consider visiting the then Edumfa prayer camp which was then under church of Pentecost. He obliged since there was nothing else to do. He was miraculously healed upon reaching the camp.He accepted Christ as his Lord and personal saviour immediately during one of the alter calls. As a Christian, he was very devoted and committed to the teaching of the bible. He accepted the fact that, he cannot keep many wives while a Christian. He settled and divorced the rest leaving Deaconess Alima Zumaro the surviving spouse.

Because of his love and devotion for Christ, he dedicated his time, land and other properties for the progress of the church of Pentecost. He also played a pivotal role in the growth of the Church of Pentecost in the Madina district. He was one of the pioneers in the establishment of the defunct Northern Outreach Ministry (NOM). He retired from active service as an Elder with the Haatso West Assembly of the Church of Pentecost, Haatso District.

He lived peacefully with people around him making sure that everyone that meets him get to know Jesus Christ. Elder Solomon was very affable and respected all persons irrespective of their age or religion.

Elder Solomon was taken ill and upon direction by his personal Doctor, was sent to the Emergency Surgical department of the 37 Military Hospital for treatment. On Tuesday June 9,2020 at exactly 7 am, a week after he had been admitted, the family members around realized his breathing has changed and they quickly informed the doctors who tried their best to stabilize him but God wanted his servant Elder Solomon to be with him. He is survived by a spouse and ten children.


