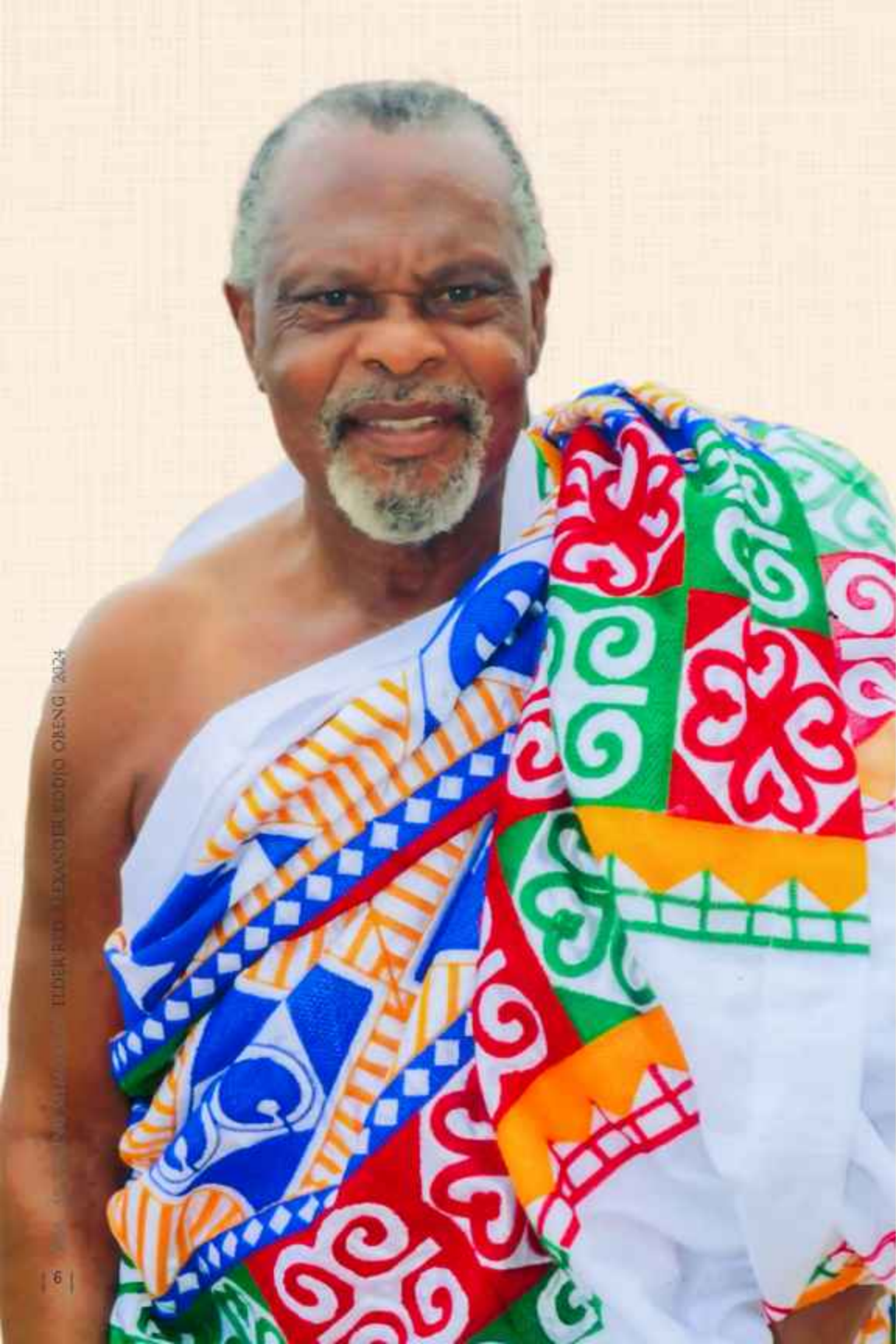

# Biography

OF THE LATE **ALEXANDER KWADWO OBENG**



**W**e thank God for the privilege this morning to say farewell to our brother, cousin, nephew, father, uncle, grandfather, great-grandfather, husband and friend, Kwadwo Obeng whom God in His wisdom has called home to eternal rest. His departure was too sudden for us; but to God, we give glory, honour and praise. The late Alexander Kwadwo Obeng was born on the 15<sup>th</sup> of June 1938 at Begoro in the Eastern Region to Opanyin Kweku Akata Botwe and Madam Adjoa Faah, all of blessed memory from Akyem Begoro. Kwadwo was one of nine children made up of six boys and three girls. He began his elementary school education at Presbyterian Primary School in the year 1947 where

he passed the common entrance examination with scholarship but could not gain admission to Aggrey Memorial Secondary School due to lack of funds but later had admission to Saint John's Secondary School. After completion he became a teacher at a newly established Anglican Secondary School in Begoro in the year 1959. Mr. Kwadwo Obeng later pursued agricultural training under the Agric Ministry and later stationed at Apedwa.

He met a young pretty lady; Georgina Ampomaa in the year 1960 in the Presbyterian Church where they were both choristers and their friendship later blossomed and got married in 1961. The marriage was blessed with four children. Alexander was later selected to join the Police Force after the collapse of the agricultural sector. Divine providence led him to work with Ghana Airways thereafter, he left Ghana Airways and joined Aeroflot, a Russian Airline when it was first established. Due to the 1966 coup d'etat, Aeroflot left the country and

that brought him to establish his own travel agency, Afrilink Travels & Tours.

Once upon a time, Alexander, converted to Muslim but upon much reflection on his spiritual walk with God and his family, his wife, Georgina being instrumental in persuading him, he reiterated his steps back to Christendom and joined his wife at the Pentecost Church at Mary Villas, Accra and stood the test of his faith.

In the year 1974, Kwadwo had the opportunity to travel to the United States of America where he lived most of his life. From the year 1974 to 2013, Mr. Obeng worked at various companies, hospital and pharmaceutical institutions in Brooklyn, Bronx and New Jersey. After retirement, he returned to Ghana and lived in his residence at Ashongman with his wife till he passed on to glory.

Kwadwo Obeng is survived by his wife Georgina, children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, the entire families and a host of the Pentecost fraternity (both abroad and local), and many friends to mourn him. Mr. Obeng lived a full life, using his

God-given gift not only for the good of his family and himself but to the benefit of all and sundry. We thank the gracious Lord for his life and humbly ask Him to grant Kwadwo eternal peace and rest.

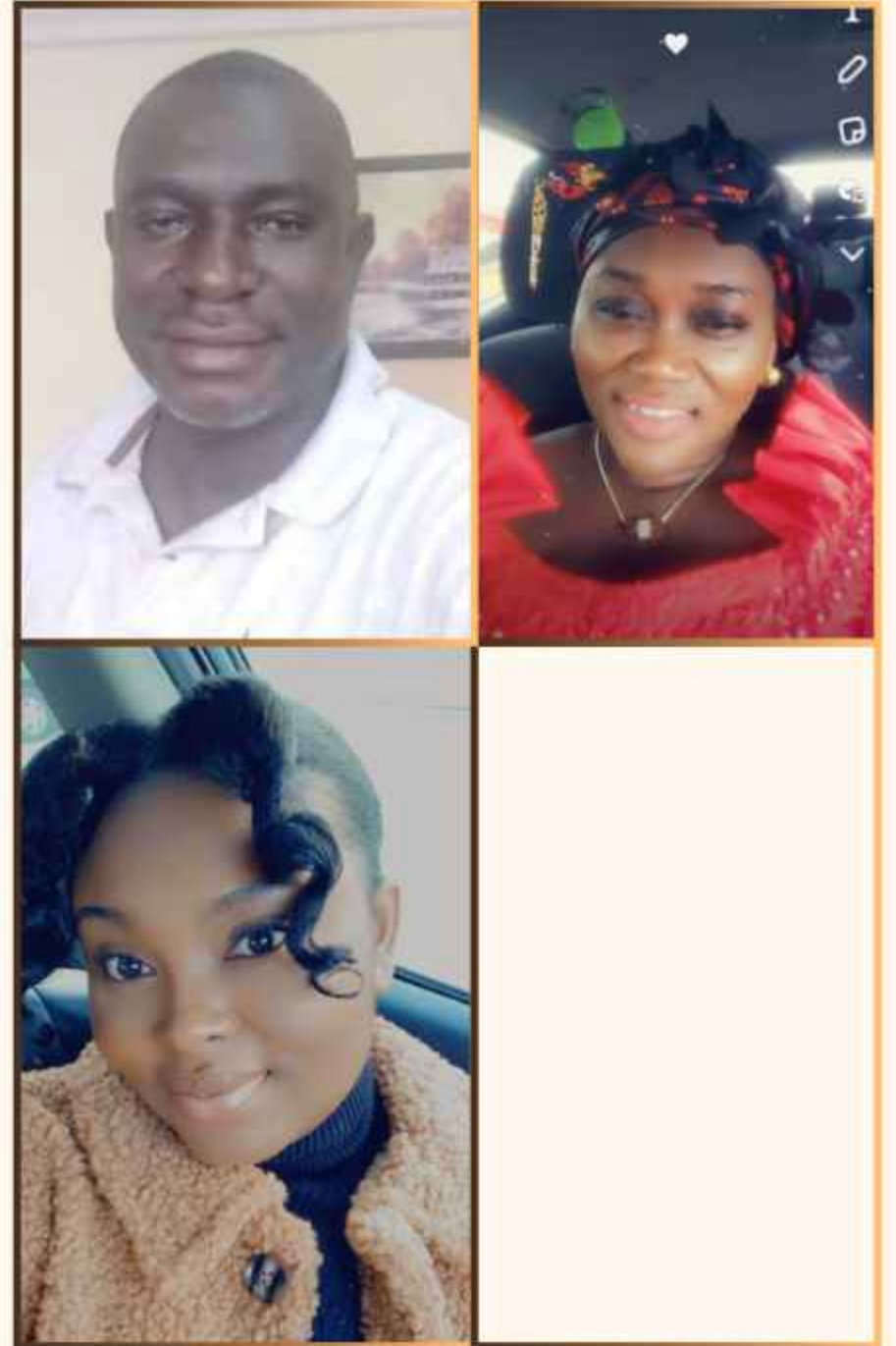

# TRIBUTE BY THE CHURCH OF PENTECOST

to the Late Elder Alexander Obeng



*"I heard a voice from heaven say, Write this: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on." "Yes," says the Spirit, "they will rest from their labor, for their deeds will follow them." (Revelation 14:13).*

Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of his faithful servants." (Psalm 116:15).

Upon immigrating to the United States as an ordained deacon of the Church of Pentecost, Elder Alexander Obeng aligned himself with the foundational members of the church, gathering at Elder Eric Oppong's residence in 1988. They decided to rent a place as the members began to increase at Harlem, New York and established the maiden branch of the Church of Pentecost, USA Incorporated. In 1989, during the inaugural visit of the International Executive, presided over by the then Chairman Prophet Yeboah, Elder Alexander received ordination alongside the late Aps. Dr. Owusu Bediako. This

marked a significant milestone as the first ordained Elders of the Church in the U.S., coinciding with the church's burgeoning international recognition. Elder Alexander's foresight and dedication came to the fore as he identified the initial meeting venues on Third Avenue in the Bronx and later secured the current location at 621 E 216th Street. Elder Obeng was initially appointed as the Chairman of the building committee in the early 1990s to oversee transformation of 621 E 216th Street into vibrant worship center. His influence extended beyond New York, as evidenced by his pivotal role in establishing the Yonkers Assembly and contributing to churches in Maryland, Virginia, and other regions where he resided. Instrumental in the establishment and expansion of the Newark Assembly, he served as its Presiding Elder from 1994 to 1997, spearheading the acquisition of their church building on 193 Avon Ave., Newark. Alongside his wife, he initiated and pioneered the Manhattan cell group, a nucleus that later blossomed into the thriving PIWC New York. Elder Alexander's leadership

extended to remarkable roles within the Church of Pentecost USA Inc. He notably served as the first PEMEF leader in Bronx Central and later served as the first National PEMEF leader in the USA. He was among the pioneering executive members during Apostle Ansong's leadership in the mid-1990s. Throughout his life, Elder Alexander epitomized unwavering faith and dedication to God's work. His contributions to the Church of Pentecost USA were immeasurable, underscored by his distinguished service in various capacities. As a devoted family man, he cherished his wife and children, commemorating the weddings of his two daughters on the same day during Apostle Ansong's tenure. His legacy is characterized by a steadfast moral compass, unwavering principles, and a warm sociable demeanor that endeared him to all generations within the church community. ***The loss of Elder Alexander is deeply felt, yet we find solace in the hope of his eternal rest until we are reunited in the realms beyond. Elder Obeng, Rest in Perfect Peace!***
