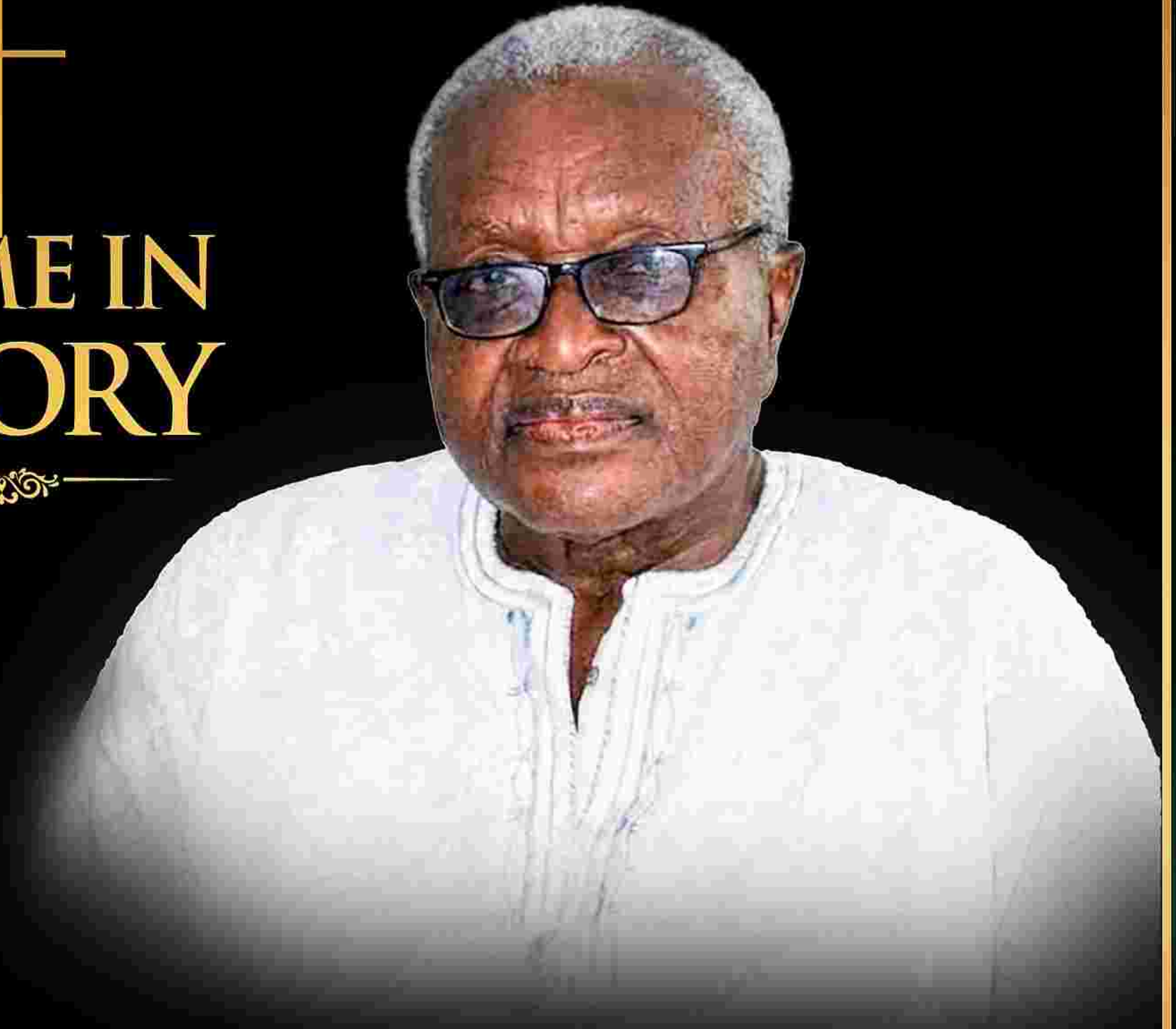

BIOGRAPHY OF JOHN TITUS NARH ROBERTS

“And I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me, Write, Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth: Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours; and their works do follow them.”

Revelation 14:13

John Titus Narh Roberts was born in Accra on December 12th, 1933, to the late Samuel Kwao Mensah Roberts, an Engineering Superintendent with Ghana’s Post and Telecommunications Department (P&T), and the late Mary Ashiedua Mensah. He was the second of three children born in the marriage.

His elementary education took him across Cape Coast, Sekondi-Takoradi, Accra, and Koforidua, due to his father’s multiple transfers—a pattern that would later be mirrored in his own adult life. Throughout these years, he faithfully served in the Anglican Church, often rising early to open the church and light the candles.

His faith, calling, and sense of purpose—hallmarks of his life as God continually perfected His work in him—began as early as the age of nine, when he was a Mass Server and Altar Boy in the Anglican Church. Between 1942 and 1943, he served at St. Andrew’s Church, Sekondi. In 1944, he continued his service at All Saints Church, Adabraka, and from 1945 to 1946 at the Anglican Church in Koforidua. He later served at the Anglican Church in Cape Coast from 1946 to 1948.

He attended Adisadel College for his secondary education beginning in 1949, where he distinguished himself and became a Prefect.

He was actively involved in boxing and also served as a Chorister, reflecting both his discipline and love for music. He completed his sixth form in 1957 and, in the same year, gained admission to the then University of Science and Technology (UST).

He remained at UST until 1960, after which he enrolled at the Telecom Engineering School in Tesano, Accra.

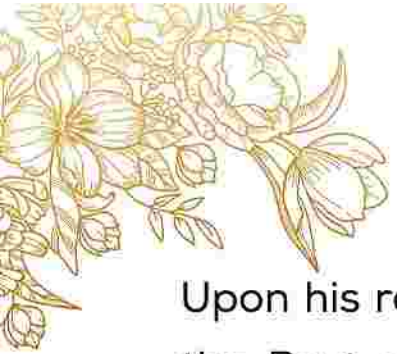
Between 1961 and 1962, he served as a Technical Superintendent with the then Post and Telecommunications Corporation of Ghana (P&T). Shortly thereafter, he was selected as one of a few Ghanaian engineering students sponsored by the government to further their studies in Britain.

In 1963, he began his studies at the University of London’s Plymouth campus, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering in 1966.

John met his wife Catherine at an engagement party in 1962 shortly before departing for his tertiary education in England. Not long after, their own engagement followed, culminating in marriage. This marriage has been blessed with 4 children and subsequently 4 grandchildren to date.

After completing his studies, along with practical training in Holland and Leeds, John returned home to Ghana. Like many of his generation, he was driven by the excitement of contributing to the growth of a newly independent nation. In a remarkable display of loyalty and patriotism, he declined an opportunity for employment with the British Government, choosing instead to return home and play his part in advancing Ghana’s development.

Upon his return to Ghana, he had a position waiting for him with the Post and Telecommunications Corporation (P&T), where he served as an Engineer in the Accra office. Between then and 1975, his responsibilities included overseeing the construction and maintenance of underground telephone cables in the metropolitan region, supervising subscriber telephone installations and maintenance, as well as managing Public Automatic Telephone Exchange systems.

In 1972, his responsibilities expanded when he was appointed Head of the Telephone Section at the Telecommunications Engineering School. In this role, he was responsible for planning training programmes for telephony courses and also served as a lecturer in Telephony.

John Titus Narh Roberts subsequently rose to the position of Senior Engineer with the Post and Telecommunications Corporation (P&T) in 1975. In February 1978, he was appointed Regional Director for the Central Region, where he assumed responsibility for the regional administration of both postal and engineering functions, as well as overseeing engineering operations in the field. He served in this role until June 1980.

In 1976, he attained professional recognition as a Corporate Member (M.Gh.I.E.) of the Ghana Institution of Engineers (GhIE) and was also admitted as a Chartered Engineer (C.Eng., M.I.E.E.) with the Institution of Electrical Engineers (now the IET) in 1977, the first Post and Telecommunications Corporation (P&T) member of the institute.

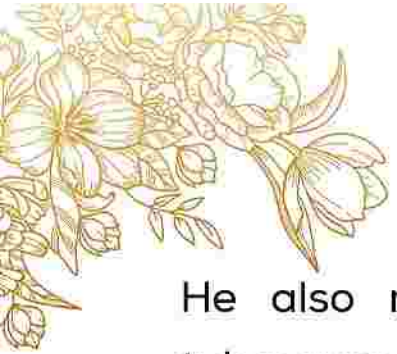
From 1978 to 1980, he additionally served as Chief Examiner for the Joint Ghana–City & Guilds of London Institute. In this capacity, he was responsible for setting examination questions and marking scripts for the course Elementary Telecommunications Practice (E.T.P.).

In April 1981, John Titus Narh Roberts voluntarily retired from the P&T Corporation of Ghana and took up an appointment with The Gambia Telecommunications Department in Banjul as a Senior Telecommunications Engineer. In this role, he was responsible for the operations and maintenance of all switching systems and external plants across the country.

On July 1, 1982, he was promoted to the rank of Chief Telecommunications Engineer, with responsibility for the operations and maintenance of telecommunication services in The Gambia. When the Gambia Telecommunications Department transitioned into GAMTEL in January 1985, his role expanded to include oversight of all projects, as well as training and development.

Among his key achievements was his involvement in the 117 million French Francs telecommunications project in partnership with SOFRECOM, a French company, which became operational in November 1986. He was also nominated to coordinate telecommunications activities between The Gambia and other Commonwealth countries under the auspices of the Commonwealth Telecommunications Organization. In 1983, he was elected as a member of the Senegambia Telecommunications Commission by the Gambian Minister of Works and Telecommunications.

He also represented The Gambia at multiple international telecommunications conferences.

John contributed significantly to his field through his publications in various telecommunications journals and presented two papers at the Commonwealth Telecommunications Project Management Seminar held in Cyprus in March 1988.

At the end of 1988, he concluded his contract with the Gambian government and took a well-deserved break. However, in April 1989, he was called once again to service and was deployed by the Commonwealth Fund for Technical Cooperation of the Commonwealth Secretariat to then Western Samoa, where he served as Chief Engineer of the Western Samoa Post Office. He held this position until the end of 1992.

John Titus Narh Roberts went on pension in 1993, though consulted and worked contracts for a few organizations.

His distinguished professional career afforded him the opportunity to travel extensively and experience many parts of the world. While John had a full plate in his professional and family life he simultaneously served in multiple ministry capacities. He was Chaplain of The Gideons International, Banjul Camp, The Gambia, from 1981 to 1988, overseeing the distribution of Bibles and Testaments to schools, hospitals and hotels alongside preaching the word of God and highlighting God's special relationship with Israel. From 1989 to 1992, he was appointed Chairman for the South Pacific region of The Gideons International.

He was actively involved in ministry through Youth for Christ and Friends of Israel, and was a committed member of the soul-winning team, at Bethel Praise Ministry International Church, where he served as a Deacon and was later ordained as an Elder.

In 2016, he was appointed an Elder at Christ Pentecostal Praise Family, a role he faithfully fulfilled until he was called Home to Glory on March 10, 2026.

John Titus Narh Roberts remained of sound mind and good health—still driving as of his 90th birthday—when subtle changes he described as “part of old age” began to appear. As his strength gradually declined, any concern was gently met with his reassuring words, “No cause for alarm,” a phrase he held onto until he lost consciousness.

On March 2nd, it became necessary for him to receive medical attention at Crown Hospital in Adenta, where his condition worsened. He was transferred to University of Ghana Medical Center on March 5th, where he was stabilized and moved from the emergency department to a ward.

On March 10th, after a morning visit with family, he took his final breath—leaving this world for his eternal home in glory.

This is the biography of John Titus Narh Roberts, an accomplished man whose life reflected the fullness of God's calling and purpose. Truly, a life well lived. Well done, good and faithful servant of the Most High God.

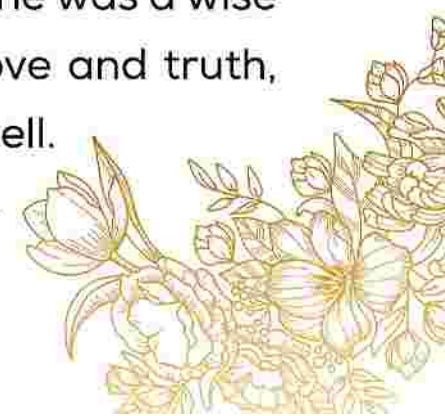
He taught us all, without ever saying a word, that true greatness in God's kingdom is found in humble service.

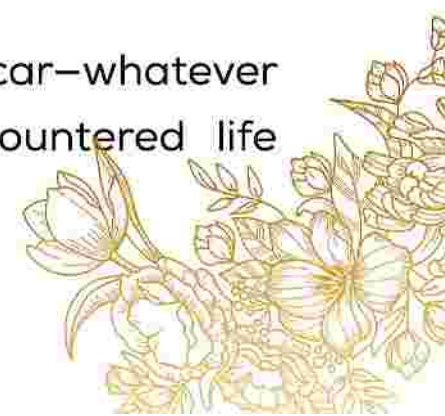

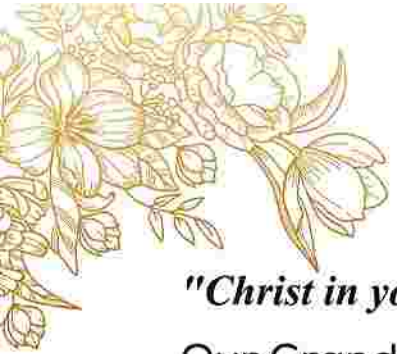
