EULOGY OF THE LATE MADAM EVA OBOSHIE SAI (AKA SISTER LEFUA)

Mad. Eva Oboshie Sai was born on September 28, 1946 at Osu to Mr. Sai Obodai of blessed memory and Mad. Florence Akufio Lomotey of Osu Kinkawe. Sis Lefua attended Manhea Girls School at Osu, Ako Adjei and proceeded to Accra Secretarial to study Stenography and French. She passed with distinction in French and was awarded a scholarship to study French in France.

Sister Lefua started her working life at State Insurance Company (SIC) in 1967 where she rose through the ranks to become a marketing officer. She resigned and established her own insurance agency specializing in motor policy and pursued this line of business for a considerable period.

Sister Lefua grew up in a Christian home. She was baptized and had confirmation at PCO Epiphany Congregation, Kaajaano. She was elected as a Presbyter from 1995 to 1998. She lived in the Lord and was a devoted and committed member of the church. She was a counsellor to several young men and women. Her words were few but carried weight. Undoubtedly, she was molded in the traditional Presbyterian upbringing. God endows individuals with various talents and gifts.

In the year 2005 she relocated to Dallas, US where she continued to work until she retired permanently from work. During her stay in the States, she visited the UK frequently to see her children Baaba and Paa Kwesi and also to establish a special bond with her grand-children.

Sister Lefua returned to Ghana from the USA in 2015 and continued relentlessly with her Christian life. About two years ago she wanted to win more souls for Christ. And in that quest to win souls for Christ she walked from Dzorwulu to Abelenkpe traffic light once a week to share the word of God with the street hawkers. Sister Lefua was always preaching and appealing for togetherness in the family.

Sister Lefua embraced, encouraged and empowered other children in the family to pursue their education and independence.

As Sister Lefua lies in state today, we recollect with nostalgia her unique gift of a melodious voice that she uses to sing hymns at the least opportunity. She had a penchant for cooking and she ensured and insisted that visitors to her home always had a meal which they consumed with inordinate salivation. Sister Lefua appreciated anything given to her no matter how small. She always admired her children and grandchildren.

Sister Lefua was a very honest and straight to the point person and would tell you the truth as she perceived it without fear or favor and always stood her ground.

On Dec. 12, 2020 our sister, daughter and mother felt unwell and was admitted to the Nyaho Hospital where she was later called to her maker in the early hours of Dec 14th 2020.

We pray that she would lie in the bosom of Jehovah and enjoy peace and everlasting rest.

It sounded like a dream, shock and sorrow, overwhelmed us when we heard the news of the untimely demise of our mother and sister. We did not know she will be leaving to her maker so soon. Auntie Eva as she was affectionately called by all, was a member of the P. C. G Epiphany Congregation, Kaajaano. She was elected as a Presbyter from the year 1995 to 1998.

Onukpa Eva Oboshie Sai lived for the Lord and was a devoted and committed member of the church. She was regular, punctual and participated fully in all church activities be it in groups or congregational programmes and mingled freely with all, irrespective of age. She had a great respect for the young and old. She had since 1995 been a Family Life Educator and had taken several young men and women through pre-marital counselling. She was a member of the Harvest Committee, for several years.

She led in raising funds in 2001 for the erection of Church's belfry which stands as a monument to her memory to the glory of God. She received the prestigious Epiphany Awards "Grand Medal" for her enormous contribution to the church in 1996. For about almost a decade ago since her return from abroad her devotion to the Lord's service has been very remarkable. This saw her serving the Lord as a Liturgist, Lay Preacher (Epiphany and other congregations), Family Life Educator and serving on many committees, the latest being the immediate past District CLAN Director which ended in December 2020 and was awarded for her selfless service.

She never missed the church's Tarry Sessions. Auntie Eva supported the church financially and she was also a patron for many groups in the church and a very active one at that. She worked behind the scenes offering counselling to persons who required it.

She was very observant and could read in between the lines in most situations and offered any necessary help in such times, be it in cash, kind and counsel. Her words were few but carried much weight.

Today we celebrate the life of a God fearing woman and peace maker, who sacrificed her time, strength and finances for God. She will be remembered for her commitment to serve, her willingness to support the Lord's work and her sense of generosity. Her departure has created a big vacuum that will be difficult to fill. Onukpa Auntie Eva, you have served your maker, your family, your church and the rest of mankind in your time. We are comforted that you have gone home to rest in perfect peace in the arms of your maker.

We believe God has called you to a higher service in heaven, now that your earthly race has ended. The Epiphany Congregation Presbyters' Conference extend their heartfelt condolences to the bereaved family and pray that the Lord shall continue to console and comfort you all. We know the Lord has ordered this and we rest in silence on His will. We wish you safe journey as you leave this sinful world and God hides you in His bosom, the Lord you loved and served.
