

Francis Alfred Tandoh, aka Paa Kwesi was born at Adedenkpo in Accra Central in the Accra Metropolis on 21st May, 1967 to the late Francis Alfred Tandoh (Opanyin Kobina Tandoh) of Ewusie Kwansah Anona Ebusua of Apam and the late Madam Leticia Acquah of Amissah Nsona Ebusua of Saltpond, both in the Central Region. Paa Kwesi was born into the Roman Catholic faith because his father was a staunch Catholic. That is clear from his baptism and confirmation names, Francis Alfred.

Francis started basic education at F'eden Preparatory School at a very tender age because he always accompanied his step-mother, Madam Ellen Osei Konadu, who was a teacher, to school. He later continued at Kpehe Roman Catholic Primary School where he also completed Middle School Education.

Upon completing the Kpehe Roman Catholic Middle School, he was admitted at the City Secondary and Business College near Caprice in Accra, where he obtained the G.C.E O'Level Certificate.

With a desire to further his education, he enrolled at the Workers' College in 1989 and obtained the G.C.E. Advanced Level Certificate in 1991.

After Workers' College - Accra, Paa Kwesi joined ADICOPA Farms, a pineapple exporting business and worked closely with the Managing Director, Mr Joe Addo-Yobo. Paa Kwesi would soon leave ADICOPA Farms to pursue his entrepreneurial drive.

He started a retail shop at the Malam Atta Market at Accra New Town. Later, he joined the newly established Madison General Insurance Company Limited, a company which became known as Metropolitan Insurance, now Hollard) in 1995. Paa Kwesi worked with the company for more than a decade. He exhibited great passion and commitment to his work which earned him several awards in the company, including the Overall Best Worker in 2003 and Long Service Award for 10 Years of Continuous Service.

In 2008, Francis Alfred Tandoh joined Globe Info Systems, a software development company as the Insurance Technical Advisor and led the deployment of the company's footprints across the country. Due to his love for insurance, Paa Kwesi returned to his passion by taking up an underwriting role at the Madina Branch of Donewell Insurance Ltd for about two years. But as fate would have it, Alfred returned to Globe Info Systems for a short spell before switching again to the insurance industry and joined Directline Risk Consult, a risk management and insurance consulting firm.

Francis Alfred Tandoh rendered distinguished service to the Consult and rose to become its General Manager. He executed all his tasks with diligence and achieved the best of results for the Consult.

Family life

Paa Kwesi was a family man. Having met beautiful and lovely Rita Ampong (Yaa Ampomaa) in Accra in 1996, the two got married the same year. The union was blessed with three lovely children; Jojo, Francisca and Ato Kwamina. However, some unfortunate circumstances robbed the union of its going concern entitlement.

But that did not deter the young ambitious strongman, as Paa Kwesi sought the hands of Dzifa Tetteh in marriage which came into fruition in 2013. That union too was blessed with three (3) lovely children; Maame Aba, Lord and Abeiku Ben. He had another son, Fiifi. In all, the Almighty God blessed Paa Kwesi with seven (7) children.

Though a Catholic, Alfred occasionally joined his children to fellowship at the Presbyterian Church during the latter part of his life. Paa Kwesi was humble, affable, sociable, full of humour and a good conversationalist. His retentive memory was legendary. All Paa Kwesi needed was a conversation and years later he can recall almost the entire conversation with astonishing accuracy.

During the latter part of 2023, he started experiencing some health challenges for which he sought medical care at the Korle-Bu Teaching Hospital where he was admitted and discharged on some occasions. The family tried all they could to have Paa Kwesi recover from his ailment and get back to happy and normal life. Alas! What is destined to be fulfilled knows no failure.

On the 29th of February, 2024, the Lord called him to His eternal Glory. Paa Kwesi, though we love and miss you dearly, we believe that the Lord needed you most.

Indeed, we have lost a precious and irreplaceable gem who has played his part in his God-given journey on earth.

Paa Kwesi is survived by seven (7) children, a host of siblings, cousins, family men and women.

You fought bravely and honorably. Rest in eternal peace till we meet again.


















TRIBUTE BY SIBLINGS
