


In 1990, he decided to pursue new opportunities in Accra, seeking greener pastures for his family.

Our time together may have been cut short, but


the impact you made on my life will last an eternity. Until we meet again, know that my love for you remains steadfast, and your presence will forever be felt in my heart.

TRIBUTE FROM THE MUSAMA DISCO CHRSITO CHURCH -MADINA STATION

For we know that if the earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. (2 Cor 5:1)

Elder Robert joined Madina Musama Church in 1990. Owing to his dedication and outspoken nature, he was appointed as the Station Church Elder in 1992. He played a pivotal role in the establishment of the Madina Singing Ministry in 1993.

Under his inspiring leadership, the church community flourished, attracting numerous new members. The church's growth was so remarkable that in 1996, a new branch named Nkwantanang Branch was inaugurated. In the absence of a pastor, he took on the responsibility as the Presiding Elder and the Acting Worker of the Nkwantanang branch for several years.

In 2005, the Nkwantanang branch merged with the Madina branch after the passing of the Rev S.K. Mensah, the Madina Station Pastor, on whose compound the Madina Branch Service was held. The amalgamated congregation became the new Madina Station, and he was entrusted with the position of Station Elder, leading the church through this transition without a resident pastor.

Eventually, in 2006, the station was blessed with a resident pastor, Pastor Afari. The following year, in 2007, recognizing his exceptional leadership abilities, he was appointed as the Circuit Elder of the Accra East Circuit. This circuit comprised several churches, including Labadi, Haatso, Dome, Teshie No 1, Teshie No 2, Nungua, and Madina Station and served for 4 years.

He served as the Elder of the Madina branch from 1992 to 2007 until he was elected as the Circuit Elder. In 2010, the Church made the decision to join the Bubuashie Circuit, primarily for the sake of proximity and convenience. During this transition, a new individual was elected as the Station Elder to lead and oversee the congregation.

He was re-elected as the Madina Station Elder in 2017. He was also appointed as the Porter for the Bubuashie Circuit in 2020. He held these positions till his demise.
