

Alexander Nana Kofi Appeaning fondly known as Ojam or KGB was born on March 9th,1943 in Kumawu Woraso, Ashanti Region - Ghana, to the late Nana Kofi Gyekye, former Woraso Chief and the late Madam Akua Manu Nyantakyiwaa from the Asona clan, Ashanti-Region.

He was the eighth of 26 siblings, 15 of which are deceased leaving behind 11 siblings. Alexander commenced his education at Woraso Presbyterian Primary School (from 1950-1956) and continued with his middle school education at Bodumasi Methodist School from 1957-1960 where he was awarded a middle school certificate in 1960.

He was a very studious person who did not take his education for granted. He earned a scholarship after high school due to his academic prowess and excellence to a University in Russia where he studied Engineering. He went on to further his education, to attain a master's degree in engineering.

During his stay in Russia, he met his first wife Mrs. Zoya Appeaning with whom he returned to Ghana upon completion of his master's degree. They had two children, namely, Dr. Vladimir Alexander Appeaning (Louisiana) and Dr. Maria Appeaning (Minnesota).

Back in Ghana he met and married his second and third wives (Mrs Bernice Appeaning and Mrs Juliet Appeaning) with whom he had 5 children, namely Victoria Nyantakyiwaa Amoah (Texas), Jerry Nana Gyekye Kofi Appeaning (New Jersey), Pastor Nana Kwame Appeaning (New Jersey), Bernice Awo Konadu Appeaning (New Jersey) and Edward Papa Kofi Asenso Appeaning (New Jersey).

He later married Nene Ousmane Appeaning. Alexander left behind nine (9) wonderful grandchildren whom he loved and cherished, namely, Daniella Amoah, Kirsten Olive Amoah, Michael Amoah, Jahaziah Appeaning, Neriah Appeaning, Micah Appeaning, Brielle Elaine Appeaning, Israel Reinhard Appeaning, Jude Andraé Appeaning,

He loved and cherished his family so much that he believed in seeking greener pastures for them. He sacrificed his comfort by relocating his wives and children to the United States of America and made sure all the mothers were gainfully employed and the children enrolled in schools before going back to Ghana.

Alexander served with the Ghana Civil Aviation Authority, Kotoka International Airport as an Aviation Engineer and retired in 2004. He went into politics for a short period working under the administration of the late Ex-President Jerry John Rawlings and later under the administration of Ex-President John Kofi Agyekum Kufour. He started entrepreneurship when he left politics.

As an entrepreneur he was one of the directors of the Gischo Mining Company. He also supervised the renovation of numerous schools and the building of solar panels during Ex President Kufour's regime.

Alexander took his Christian life very seriously especially during the past 20 years. He trained his children to love and serve in the house of God. He helped establish the All Nations Church in Ghana and was a diligent follower of TB Joshua's teachings.



You'll forever live in my heart. I love you Twin!! Rest in perfect peace Poppie.



























We will always love and cherish you grandpa! Rest peacefully in heaven!


















