BIOGRAPHY

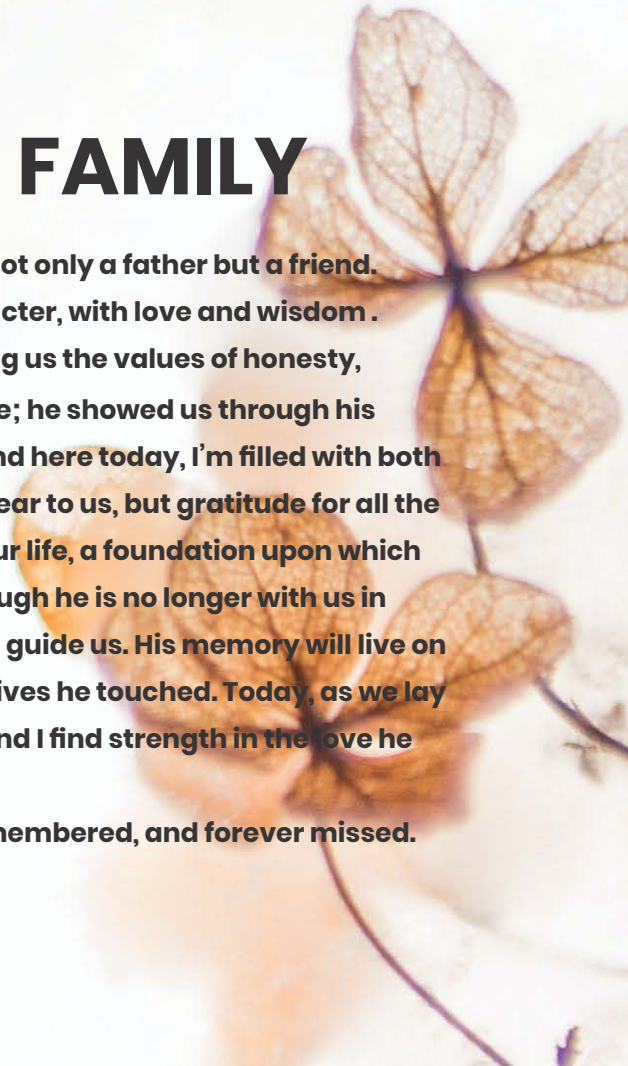
BENJAMIN AYINE ASAAYA
