### Tribute By the Church

he late Pastor Benjamin Afful began to fellowship with the Deeper Life Bible Church in Lagos, Nigeria in 1984/85. His decision to follow the Lord was divinely directed after initially resisting invitations to attend.

When Pastor Afful came to Ghana, he diligently sought to reconnect with Deeper Life but struggled to locate the churches. As an avid reader, he spotted information about the Deeper Life congregation in Adabraka in a newspaper while working at the Timber Market. Joining the Ghana church in 1986 deepened his commitment to the Lord and ministry. His devotion soon led his wife to also attend the Adabraka congregation.

Pastor Afful served faithfully in Deeper Life congregations in Adabraka, Orion Cinema, and Anyaa before the church planted Lartebiokorshie as an independent congregation. His passion for the gospel grew, and he was appointed Chief Usher in Lartebiokorshie. He shepherded a thriving house fellowship that repeatedly multiplied.

As the Lartebiokorshie church grew, Pastor Afful worked with Pastor Daniel Bonsu to launch a new Deeper Life congregation in Sukura. He was installed as the founding pastor of Sukura, where he served until his passing.

In addition to ushering, Pastor Afful contributed to Deeper Life as a member of the Sanitation, Marriage, Building, and counseling committees. At Sukura, he invested in members' lives, encouraging education and careers so they could fully participate in society. Pastor Afful modeled faithful Christian living for his congregation in all he did.

Drawing on his professional background as a building contractor, he oversaw construction of the Sukura church facility. He managed the project wisely to maximize quality while containing costs. The pastor invested heavily in the project, personally traveling to check on progress and source materials. Completing the building was extremely important to him.

Pastor Afful pursued God with great devotion and integrity. He was cautious in his habits, humble among peers and children, and friendly to all. His commitment to studying scripture equipped him to preach uncompromised biblical truth. Pastor Afful lived simply and avoided behaviors' that would compromise his witness.

The pastor maintained remarkable health and strength into his later years through self-discipline. His unexpected passing, on October 24, 2023, shocked the church community. We find comfort knowing he rests from his labors and his legacy continues through the many lives he touched.

As an entrepreneur that Kweku always was, he decided to trade as a timber merchant and established several sawmill outlets with about twenty five personnel to grow his business. This he did for more than a decade until his timber business began to experience a rough patch. He then decided after a careful consideration of events to diversify and include civil works, and building construction to his portfolio to keep the business functional and profitable.

With his remarkable qualifications and abilities, Kweku embarked on a fulfilling professional journey. He dedicated himself to his career, where he made valuable contributions to his field. Kweku left an indelible mark in his line of work. His colleagues respected him for his expertise, unwavering commitment, and ability to inspire others. Kweku's strong work ethic and determination were instrumental in his accomplishments, earning him praise and accolades throughout his career.

He was a faithful servant, a loving husband, a devoted father and a friend.


I thank the Lord, for the memories we shared and the times we stood together in prayer.
